Division	How to be divided	How to be collected
1 可燃 廃食用油 Burnables & Used cooking oil	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>●kitchen garbage ●weeds &amp; leaves ●footwear ●diapers</li> <li>●rubber &amp; leather goods ●used body warmers</li> <li>●soft plastic goods with no  marks on</li> <li>●video &amp; cassett tapes</li> <li>●stuffed toys &amp; cushions less than 30 cm width</li> <li>●used cooking oil (salad, olive, sesame, grape seed, safflower, &amp;c.)</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>●Dispose of kitchen garbages; weeds, leaves; and all other items using the designated plastic bags.</li> <li>●3 garbage bags are the maximum for a family per day.</li> <li>●Big or long items should be cut in 30cm × 30cm.</li> <li>●Drain off properly the kitchen waste ahead of the disposal.</li> <li>●Put used cooking oil into PET bottle, and then in a plastic bag. Place it separate from other waste.</li> </ul>   
2 剪定枝 Pruned waste	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>●branches (with leaves) less than 80cm long and 10cm in diameter.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>●Cut the branches less than 80cm long and 30cm in diameter. Tie them with strings.</li> <li>●3 bundles are the maximum.</li> </ul> 
3 容器包装 プラスチック Plastics	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>●Plastics with  marks on, rinsed, cleaned, and emptied: food trays, packages, cups, shampoo bottles, plastic bags and wraps, foaming polystyrene, PET bottle caps and labels &amp;c.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>●Put the plastic wastes with  marks on in (semi) transparent plastic bags.</li> <li>●They are not required to be categorized.</li> </ul> 
4 ペットボトル PET bottles	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>●With  marks on, PET bottles of soft or alcoholic drinks, soy sauce, sweet sake for seasoning</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>●Remove the labels and the caps of the bottles. Rinse and put them in (semi) transparent plastic bags.</li> </ul> 
5 新聞・折込チラシ 雑誌・雑紙 Newspapers	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>●newspapers &amp; adv. papers ●magazines</li> <li>●shredded paper wastes ●recyclable papers</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>●Each category item should be bundled; or else put into paper bags.</li> <li>●Shredded paperwaste should be put into plastic bags.</li> <li>※ On rainy days, except shuredded paper wastes, other items are required to put into plastic bags.</li> </ul> 
6 段ボール 紙パック 布類 Cardboard boxes Clothes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>●cardboard boxes, corrugated paper</li> <li>●beverage cartons with white colored inside</li> <li>●used clothes, towels, sheets,curtains, blankets &amp;c.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>●Cardboards should be folded and tied.</li> <li>●Rinse, unfold and dry the beverage paper cartons, and tie them up. Put them into plastic bags when rainy.</li> <li>●The items should be put into plastic bags. On rainy days, it is recommended to keep them for the next collection day.</li> </ul>  
7 ビン Glass bottles	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>●bottles of beverages, spices, seasonings, cosmetics &amp;c.</li> <li>※ ・Broken glass bottles are collected at Division NO.9.</li> <li>・Returnable bottles such as sake (1ℓ), soy sauce should be brought to the shop where they were bought.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>●Empty, rinse the bottles and put them in plastic bags.</li> <li>●Any colored or sized bottle can be put in one bag mixedly.</li> </ul> 
8 空き缶類 Cans	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>●beverage &amp; food cans</li> <li>●fuel cans for portable cookers</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>●Rinse and clean food &amp; beverage cans; do not crash them; and put them in plastic bags.</li> </ul> 
9 破碎ごみ Hard plastics	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>●hard plastic items (goods) without  marks on, e.g. CDs, toys, buckets</li> <li>●furniture removable by a man e.g. drawers, bookcases, desks, chairs, less than 1m high or wide</li> <li>●broken bottles, heat-resistant glass bottles</li> <li>●blinds, shades and screen (bamboo, reed, plastic &amp;c.)</li> <li>●ceramics and glassware</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>●Put small items in a plastic bags.</li> <li>●Bundle or fold long and rod shaped items, if possible.</li> <li>●Broken pieces of items such as glass &amp; ceramic should be put into (semi) transparent bags.</li> </ul>  
10 金属 寝具類 Hardware (Metal waste) & Bed clothes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>●kettles, pans, saucepans</li> <li>●caps and lids of bottles, cans, candy cans and boxes &amp;c.</li> <li>●knives (fruit, kitchen, carving &amp;c.)</li> <li>●iron hangers ●cutlery</li> <li>●bicycles ●clothes drying bars</li> <li>●futon and comforters ●Japanese cushions &amp; rush mats</li> <li>●(electronic) carpets &amp; blankets</li> <li>●stuffed toys &amp; cusions larger than 30 cm</li> <li>●mattresses without springs inside</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>●Removing nonmetal parts as much as possible, put them in plastic bags.</li> <li>●Big items are not required to be put in plastic bags.</li> <li>●Label as “「ごみ(Waste)」”on bicycles.</li> <li>●Fold larger items into minimum and tie them up. ※ Trying to keep the items for the next collection day is welcomed on rainy days.</li> </ul>   
11 家電類 有害ごみ 蛍光灯類 Home appliances Hazardous waste Florescent light	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>●electric ovens ●printers ●cameras ●electric fans</li> <li>●fan heaters ●stoves (kerosene, electric,&amp;c.)</li> <li>●electric water kettles ●cord reels ●calculators</li> <li>●PC keyboards &amp; mice</li> <li>●batteries ●the mercury clinical thermometers and thermometers ●lighters ●spray cans</li> <li>●button cell (batteries) &amp; litium batteries</li> <li>※button cells and litium batteries could also be collected at shops cooperative to recycling movement</li> <li>●florescent lights ●bulbs</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>●Small items should be put in a plastic bag.</li> <li>●Be sure to remove batteries; empty kerosene completely.</li> <li>※ Air conditioners, TV sets, fridges, freezers, washers, dryers, PCs, are not accepted by law.</li> <li>●Items of different categories should go into each different plastic bag.</li> <li>●Lighters are strictly required to empty the fuel inside.</li> <li>●Spray cans &amp; fuel cans for portable cookers should definitely be emptied and for safty once again in them before putting them in plastic bags. Do not make a hole.</li> <li>●Put the lights in the original packages or in plastic bags.</li> <li>●Broken ones should be put in each separate bag and placed separate.</li> </ul>
